Table production for Batch 2 geographies (the rest?) will hopefully be able to start after the third group of TGPs are delivered for Batch 1 geographies (~August 10).

Two things to consider when estimating delivery dates:

- 1. Based on previous turnaround times, production starting around August 10 could put the first batch of tables for Round 2 custom geographies arriving as early as late-September and the rest of the tables arriving before the end of October.
- 2. There is a high level of uncertainty associated with some of the geocoding estimates here, which has previously translated into delays on the order of months.

Years: 2015 and 2016

- Separate guaranteed income supplement from Old Age Security

Table F-19 Census families by family type and family composition including before and after-tax median income of the family

- Addition of number of and median income for couple families with children aged 0-17

Table F-20 After-tax low income status of census families (census family low income measures, CFLIM-AT) by family type and family composition, adjusted methodology

- Add Families with children aged 0-17
- Couple Families with 0, 1, 2, 3+ children aged 0-17
