What is the Community Poverty Project?

Originally called the Urban Poverty Project, the project was developed out of the work of the Canadian Council on Social Development to carry out two primary activities:

- to provide relevant local level poverty data of use to the project partners and
- to search for factors underlying differences in poverty among communities.

Many regional and municipal governments, along with a wide range of community-based organizations participated in that first Urban Poverty Project initiative, together forming 19 consortia across Canada.
