2016 Census tables

We have received the following 2016 Census tables and they will be cataloged shortly:

- HH TGP of households in housing that are unsuitable
- HH TGP of households in subsidized housing
- HH TGP of households in need of major repairs

TGPs still on the priority list:

- TGP of the population living in households spending 30%+ or 50%+ on housing
- TGP of persons in owner/renter households
- HH TGP of multi-generational households
- TGP by mode of commuting to work, using a compatible universe to what will be used in the 2021
 Census

At standard and custom geographies

 2016 Census tables with re-based MBM: TGP and HH TGP for low-income population (MBM), as well as CPP-01 (including activity limitations data that wasn't available at the time the tables were produced)

2021 Census tables

Custom geography geocoding and table production

- StatsCan has done a lot of preliminary work on the custom geographies but won't be able to load them into the production system **until after November 30th** (their estimated date).
- Once this is done, they will produce population and dwelling count reports for all custom geographies for the geography 'owners' to review and sign off on.
- Once the counts have been approved, production can begin.
- We shouldn't expect to see any custom geography tables until **early 2023**. I'm hoping this means January, but it could easily be February before data tables start arriving.
- The first tables we'll receive at custom geographies will be the Census Profile and the detailed Age and Gender table. After that, they'll start work on our long list of Target Group Profile requests.

COVID income supports skewing income-based indicators

We are looking into what StatsCan can do about this and if they have measured the effect of the income supports. We would like to have this issue be a topic of discussion at the Leads' meeting.

REQUEST: Does anyone know of research that is being done to quantify the impact of the COVID income supports on the 2020 income data? Besides someone from StatsCan we're looking for someone who could present at the annual meeting.

TGP priority setting exercise / details on TGP specifications

The priority order for receiving Target Group Profiles was discussed, as well as the definition for some of the Target Groups. Comments on the definition of Target Group Profiles can be added to the document linked to above.

Some changes to the priority order can still be made, but the top of the list will look like this:

- TGP of the low-income population with all low income lines (Total population, MBM-2008, MBM-2018, LIM-AT, LIM-BT, LICO-AT, LICO-BT)
- TGP by age groups
- TGP by immigrant and citizenship status (non-immigrant, immigrant, recent immigrant, non-permanent resident, Total-Citizenship, citizen, non-citizen)
- TGP of the visible minority population (broken out by category, including non-visible minority and total visible minority)
- TGP of the Aboriginal identity population [Indigenous identity, Single Indigenous responses, First Nations (North American Indian), Métis, Inuk (Inuit)]

ACTION: look into getting other immigration periods for immigrant population TGP (e.g., 2011 to 2016, 2006 to 2011...)

PETER: e.g. 2016-2021, 2011-2015, 2001-2010, 1991-2000, 1981-1990, 1980 or earlier?

TED: any need for Aboriginal ancestry as a TGP?
